4th Grade Visits The U.S. Space & Rocket Center

On Friday, February 21st, the fourth grade class visited the U.S. Space & Rocket Center in Huntsville. The day was filled with numerous learning experiences. Students explored the museum, learning about the U.S.'s early space missions. They also enjoyed amazing images of our universe in the IMAX movie *Hidden Universe*. In the afternoon, students participated in a hands-on lab to test different soil samples for iron, carbonate and pH levels. This lab helped students to understand the importance of studying the moon's rocks and soil.

For many students, the highlight of the day was riding the G-Force Accelerator which simulates the feeling that astronauts experience during liftoff. It was an exciting, educational day!

Technology is a daily part of the school day at JCA. As part of the school's *Eagle*i Interactive Classroom Initiative, all 7-12th grade students have an iPad for their own use and K-6th grade use the cart program.

Mrs. Neal, who teaches fourth and fifth grade Language Arts, coaches Cross-Country and directs the Kids Are Authors contest, says her students love to use the iPads. Her fourth graders use them twice a week and fifth graders use them each day. "We use it mostly for research projects with the novels we read in class," she said. "For example, we are reading 'The Liberation of Gabriel King', researching Watergate and the Civil Rights movement as well as the bicentennial of our country, because all of that is relevant to the story." Her students also use iPads for grammar practice and cursive writing practice.

Mrs. Monosky, who teaches 8th through 12th grade Math, from Pre-Algebra to Calculus, says the iPad is helpful when projecting problems on the whiteboard. "We have built-in math software and graphing that we can use to be precise with solving problems," she says. "The students have their math textbooks on their iPad and we use a website called Khan Academy that helps teach a different perspective on math concepts."


